Piano material is from "Jazz Piano Voicings" (partner book to "How to Play and Improvise", volume 1). Bass material is from "Rufus Reid Bass Lines" (contains bass lines from volumes 1-3). Guitar, Vibes, and trapset material comes from "Rhythm Section Workout" (Volume 30 B). Please be sure the accompaniment tracks are used and audible for all auditions.

ALL RHYTHM AUDITION AND IMPROV DIRECTIONS SHOULD STAY THE SAME.

Please delete the "improvisation" directions from the piano and bass audition excerpts in Cycle 3

There will be no separate improvisation from "How to Play and Improvise" (for the horns, only, for right now).

Horn improvisations will be as follows:

Cycle 1 should read as follows:

- Slow Blues in F (track 4): Play the melody twice
- Fast Blues in Bb (track 5): Play the melody. Improvise a solo through the repeated chord progression (12 bars). Play the melody again.

Cycle 2 should read as follows:

- Long Meter Jazz/Rock (track 6): Play the melody twice.
- Horizontal (track 8): Play the melody. Improvise a solo through the repeated chord progression (12 bars). Play the melody again.

Cycle 3 should read as follows:

- Bird Blues (track 12): Play the melody twice.
- Home Stretch (track 7): Play the melody. Improvise a solo through the repeated chord progression (12 bars). Play the melody again.
